Joseph Stephen
Private U.S. Army
2 October 1862 – 19 October 1864

Joseph was born circa 1844 in Lower Macungie Township, He worked as a farmer before he enlisted in the Union Army. He enlisted in Allentown, Pennsylvania, as a Private on 2 October 1862 and was assigned to Company I, 47th Pennsylvania Volunteer Infantry Regiment. The 47th Regiment had been formed and assembled at Camp Curtin, Harrisburg, Pennsylvania, a year prior to Joseph's enlistment and had been deployed to Fort Ethan Allen near McLean, Virginia; Fort Taylor at Key West, Florida; and Hilton Head, South Carolina, where they performed picket duty until October 1862. Joseph apparently joined the Regiment at Hilton Head, During October, the Regiment boarded transport ships at Beaufort, South Carolina, bound for Mackey's Point, South Carolina, where they disembarked. From there they marched to the Village of Pocotaligo, which was less than ten miles distant, where they were to burn the railroad bridge and destroy as much railroad track as possible. They engaged the Confederates there on 21-23 October 1862. The Confederates rushed in reinforcements and, as night fell on October 23, the Union Commander ordered a retreat. They reembarked at Mackay's Point on the transport ships and returned to Beaufort. They remained at Beaufort until 15 November 1862, when they returned to Key West, with Company I occupying Fort Taylor with five other companies in the Regiment. They remained in garrison at Fort Taylor until 25 February, 1864, when they moved to New Orleans, Louisiana, and were attached to 2nd Brigade, Provisional Division, under the Army of the Shenandoah, From there they participated in the Red River Campaign in Louisiana from the period 10 March to 22 May 1864 at the Battles of Sabine Cross Roads at Mansfield on 8 April 1864; Pleasant Hill on 9 April; Monett's Ferry, Cane River

Crossing on 23 April; Morganza on 13 May; and Mansura on 16 May. They then returned to New Orleans where they remained until 5 July 1864. They then returned to Washington, D.C., and from there took part in General Sheridan's Shenandoah Valley Campaign in Virginia. In that campaign they saw action at the Battle of Opequan at Winchester, Virginia, and Fisher's Hill, Virginia, on the 19th and 22nd of September 1864, respectively. On 19 October 1864 they engaged the Confederates again at the Battle of Cedar Creek in Virginia. After the battle of Cedar Creek Joseph was missing in action and was never found. In July 1865

he was declared killed in action on 19 October 1864 during the battle. Joseph's parents were **Zebulon Stephen** (27 March 1818 – 23 June 1892) and **Anna Caroline Rethler** (4 April 1826 – 7 March 1850).


Joseph enlisted as Joseph Stephfen. In his service record we can see his name changing to Joseph Stephens over time. Sometimes entered as Stephfen-Stephens.

Joseph was missing in action on 19 October 1864 in the Battle of Cedar Creek. Listed as missing or a prisoner of War. In July 1865 they declared that Joseph died in the Battle of Cedar Creek. We do not know where he is buried. The dead at Cedar Creek were first buried at the Cooley farm. They were later taken to the Winchester, VA National Cemetery. We think he is there buried as an UNKNOWN. The mustering out of the 47th Pa, July 1865 noted Joseph Stephen lost on 19 October 1864 at Battle of Cedar Creek.

Oct 1, 2014; after several visits to Cedar Creek this is what happened to the best of my knowledge. The 1st Division 2nd Brigade of the 19th Corps Commanded by General Stephen Thomas was not entrenched near Belle Grove, the Union far right. When the early morning attacked started they moved from their position across the Valley Pike (RT 11) 200 hundred yards to the top of the heights. Led by the 8th Vermont, 160th New York, 12th Connecticut and 47th PA. While moving to their position, the men of the 8th Corps (Army of West Virginia) were pouring through their ranks and were in full retreat. To make things worst, the morning fog was very heavy. The Brigade fired blindly into the on coming Confederate army from the heights. The 47th on the extreme right started to have their flank turned and begone fighting in a semi circle with their line bent back to the right. As the Brigade withdrew from the heights, the Confederates now on the heights, fired down at them in the ravine. The new union black knapsacks made easy targets in the morning fog. This info from Ranger Jeff Driscoll on Friday September 5, 2014.

12-4-2014 After having a private tour of the battlefield with CCBF guide Patrick Kehoe new facts have come to light. The 47th PA was a reserve Brigade not entrenched near Belle Grove. They were up and ready to go on a reconnaissance. This was about 4 AM on19 Oct 1864. After barely reaching the heights Evan's Georgians slammed into their front. Simultaneously a shower of canister and shrapnel from Simms's rebels, working Thoburn's captured guns. Then out of the mist on the right, Humphrey's Mississippi Brigade, Kershaw Division, pushing a swarm of Thoburn's refugees pell mell before them. The Thomas Brigade right flank




